




RIDING for the DISABLED

Riding for Disabled is a volunteer organisation catering to the needs of children with physical and intellectual disabilities and social disorders through horse related activities.

The Riding program is held at Dalton Park Griffith from April to November each year during school term.

Current days of operation are Monday to Wednesday. Lessons are instructed by a qualified coach with volunteers assisting.

During the 45-minute lessons, children learn the basics of riding horses according to their level of

Group lessons are limited in size, due to availability of suitable horses, specific riding requirements, and volunteers. Lessons are both valuable physically, mentally, and socially for all involved.

For the children, riding is a unique form of exercise and therapy. The complex movement of the horse helps to improve coordination, balance, muscle development and strength





Horse riding and horse related activities assist greatly and often dramatically in the development and restoration of personal confidence, self-esteem, communication skills, leadership and trust.

Vocal instructions by children to horses and handlers, promotes speech and confidence.

Interactive communication occurs between horse handlers, volunteers, and children. Handlers and volunteers aim to care for the child, making their daily experience positive and rewarding.

Our centre is run by a dedicated group of volunteers, aided by a committee of enthusiastic people committed to providing quality services to people with disabilities and disorders.
