Proposed strike day Tuesday

Dear parents and carers

The department is currently negotiating a new Award with the Teachers Federation with the help of the Industrial Relations Commission. The Industrial Relations Commission is the official place where pay negotiations take place in NSW.

The Industrial Relations Commission has ruled any industrial action by the NSW Teachers Federation is illegal while negotiations are underway, and the department is urging them to call off any industrial action including the proposed 24-hour strike on Tuesday 7 December.

As a result of the strike our school will be providing minimal supervision of students on Tuesday 7 December. This means the cohort arrangements that have been in place this term will not be in operation. However, our school will still operate in a COVID-safe manner in accordance with NSW Health quidelines.

We are doing all we can to resolve this dispute with the Federation.

The current Teachers' Award expires on 31 December 2021. Rather than wait for the outcome of an arbitration decision by the Industrial Relations Commission in May next year, the department intends to offer a 2.5% salary increase for teachers and related employees as soon as the current Award expires, ensuring our staff don't miss out. This is the maximum amount allowed per annum under the Industrial Relations Act.

We appreciate your patience and understanding during this disruption, especially given the challenges we have all faced this year. We will keep you updated on further developments as they come to hand.



CAMPAIGN LAUNCH - LHAC RECRUITMENT DRIVE

Applications have opened for the 2022 intake of volunteers to join the Local Health Advisory Committees across the Murrumbidgee District.

LHAC members come from all walks of life and have varying interests, but what unites them is that they are strong and vocal advocates who have their community's best interest at heart. Their opinions, concerns and ideas about what matters most to local people contributes enormously to health service planning and sustainability.

LHAC members share a desire to ensure successful and sustained health services that will meet the future needs of people in their region.

"It's really important that LHAC volunteers have a wide and varied range of interest that they bring to the table," said MLHD Community Engagement Manager Setchen Brimson. "We are particularly looking for people who are well connected in their local area and can speak with people from all different backgrounds to get a real sense of what's going on in their community, and where the needs and gaps are."

"What's most important is that LHAC members can give consumers in their region a voice that is heard, and they can play a pivotal role in informing health providers in making changes to future services."

There are 33 LHAC across the Murrumbidgee region, stretching from the Snowy Mountains in the east to the plains of Hillston in the northwest and all the way along the Victorian border. Each LHAC plays a role in helping to inform decisions that are made in primary and acute care by advocating for health consumers in their area.

LHAC members meet once monthly and consist of around seven community members, a clinical representative and a staff representative from MLHD. The committees are supported by the Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD) and the Murrumbidgee Primary Health Network (MPHN) and are provided with funding opportunities to work on projects which align to the strategic direction of both organisations.


LHACs work with the MPHN in areas such as understanding the primary care needs of people in their region. They participate in health needs analysis, community led planning, conversations on the couch and other co-design opportunities to ensure that community interested and concerns are taken into consideration when planning to provide service delivery.

TERTIARY/VOCATIONAL BURSARY

One \$500 Bursary to assist with tertiary study costs is available for 2022.

This is made possible by the fundraising efforts of the Rankins Springs Branch of ICPA.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Eligibility Criteria:

- The Bursary is only available to students enrolled to study at a University, Country University Centre (CUC), TAFE or Agricultural College in 2022. This includes Apprentices.
- The applicant's parents MUST be current financial members of the Rankins Springs Branch of ICPA.
- Applicants must be undertaking a full time Degree, Diploma or working towards a Certificate IV through an Apprenticeship.

Application Criteria - Must include the following information:

- Cover page to include name and contact details residential address, phone number and email address.
- Year 12 Results/ROSA Certificate.
- Proof of enrolment into chosen course of study.
- Two written references attesting to the students' character, only one can be school based.
- Resume of interests and achievements other than academic (Eq. sporting, cultural, community etc.)
- Brief statement explaining career goals and personal/family circumstances demonstrating financial need.
- Brief explanation on how the Bursary will be spent. (Eg: University/CUC students may choose to pay for first semester books or fees, an apprentice may choose to pay for tools etc.)
- Students undertaking a gap year are also eligible to apply. However, the Bursary funding will
 commence in the year of study.
- Applications must be submitted in PDF format.

- Applications must be submitted by email to the above address by the due date.

SELECTION PROCESS

- The Selection Process is to be based on, but not limited to, the above Eligibility and Application Criteria.
- An independent Selection Panel will be formed to assess all applications. The Panel has the right to privacy.
- Presentation of the Bursary will take place in March 2022 at a time to suit the recipient.
- Photos & articles of the award winner will be made available to the media and the ICPA.
